

**Sustainable Viticulture**

Sustainable Viticulture aims to limit the environmental impact of making wine. Growers who practice this kind of viticulture use chemicals less often and less aggressively than conventional growers. Sustainability can refer to a range of practices that are not only ecologically beneficial but also economically viable and socially responsible. Growers use a wide range of practices from natural pest management to the use of renewable energy.

**Organic**

A vineyard must go through a three year conversion process before it can be certified as organic. There must be no added pesticides or other synthetic chemicals used to treat the vines, instead natural fertilizers and fungicides are used. Copper and sulphur dioxide are permitted. In 2012 the EU set restrictions on winemaking for organic wines, including the level of sulphur permitted; therefore they generally have a lower level of sulphites than non-organic wines.

**Biodynamic**

Biodynamics stem from a series of lectures given by Austrian philosopher Rudolf Steiner in 1924.

His work was built upon by Erhard Bartsch, who founded Demeter, the regulatory body for worldwide biodynamic agriculture.

Biodynamic wines are by definition organic wines too; however the requirements for organic wines are just a starting point for biodynamics. Biodynamics require vineyard work and winery tasks to be done according to a calendar that is directed by lunar and astral cycles, giving rise to such things as fruit, root, leaf and flower days. Biodynamic preparations are used in place of synthetic pesticides and herbicides. These include cow manure, chamomile compost and horsetail plant tea to correct an imbalance in the vine and promote the vines natural resistance to many of nature's problems.
